Embracing 2020's Challenges

2020 has certainly been a year of change, especially related to education. When faced with the reality that Horizons at Episcopal Academy's 2020 summer learning program could not happen in person because of COVID-19, Horizons students and teachers embraced the challenge and pivoted to a virtual learning model. The cornerstone of this program was its ability to meet our students' unique learning needs. With the support of many generous donors, at-home learning resources were provided to Horizons students along with an engaging six-week virtual program.

Horizons At Home Box Deliveries

Horizons provided every student with a Horizons at Home box, which was delivered to their homes by our volunteers and staff. This box contained an Amazon Kindle Fire Tablet that was personalized with grade level learning software. In addition, art supplies, class novels, workbooks, a yoga mat, and STEM kits were included. Grocery gift cards were also provided to our families.

Virtual Learning Horizons Style

Our students started each day of the Horizons six-week program with Zoom lessons from their Horizons teachers. A traditional Horizons curriculum of language arts, math and enrichment was offered virtually. Weekly social emotional education was provided by our counselor, who also focused on mindfulness. For students who were unable to attend our live virtual classes, pre-recorded lessons were created by our teachers for students to access through our remote learning website.
